Troparion:

When Thou didst descend to death, O Life Immortal, Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead! And when from the depths Thou didst raise the dead, all the powers of heaven cried out: O Giver of Life! Christ our God! Glory to Thee!

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, full of grace! From you shone the Sun of Righteousness, Christ our God. Enlightening those who sat in darkness! Rejoice, and be glad, O righteous elder; you accepted in your arms the Redeemer of our souls, Who grants us the Resurrection.

O Prophet and Forerunner of the coming of Christ, in spite of our honor and devotion we are unable to give you worthy praise, through your glorious and noble birth your mother's childlessness was ended, your father's tongue was freed, and the incarnation of the Son of God was proclaimed to the world.

Kontakion:

Hell became afraid, O Almighty Savior, seeing the miracle of Thy Resurrection from the tomb! The dead arose! Creation, with Adam, beheld this and rejoiced with Thee! And the world, O my Savior, praises Thee forever.

The Holy Gospel According to St. Matthew. (Chapter 25:14:30)

But the one who had received the one talent came and said, 'Master, I know you are a stern man; you reap where you have not sowed and gather where you have not winnowed; and as I was afraid, I went away and hid your talent in the earth; behold, you have what is yours.' But his master answered and said to him, 'Wicked and slothful servant! You knew that I reap where I do not sow, and gather where I have not winnowed. You should therefore have entrusted my money to the bankers, and on my return I should have got back my own with interest. Take away therefore the talent from him, and give it to the one who has the ten talents. [For to everyone who has shall be given, and he shall have abundance; but from him who does not have, even that which he seems to have shall be taken away.] But as for the unprofitable servant, cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be weeping and the gnashing of teeth."
